

CHAPTER SEVENTEEN

MICHAUD - CORMIER GAGNON - ST. PIERRE HISTORY

A family history is never complete unless the ancestral lines are covered to a small extent. Although the Michaud, Cormier, Gagnon and St. Pierre lines are not contributors to the general Belanger heritage, they are a great part of the heritage for the Gerald Belanger family and his children. The pedigree of these lines is presented here along with some pictorial history.

The St. Pierre Family

The St. Pierre line is somewhat easier to trace although there is not much substantial information regarding the family. From Van Buren, Maine back to France we trace the line of the St. Pierre family. Michel St. Pierre was the first known ancestor and he was listed in the early records as Michel DeStPierre. It is not certain if Michel ever came to New France.

#1 Sandra Colombe St. Pierre, the daughter of Leo J. St. Pierre and Harriet Tilley was born on 12 October 1942 in Van Buren, Maine. Sandy grew up in Van Buren, went on to college in Boston and was employed in Washington DC when she married her husband, Jim Belanger.

#2 Leo J St. Pierre, the son of Severin St. Pierre and Clarice Dube, was born on 2 March 1912 in Van Buren, Maine. He married Harriet M Tilley on 23 April 1940 at St. Bruno's church in Van Buren. Leo and Harriet built a home on a plot of land given to them by Harriet's grandparents, the Michauds. Leo was employed as a pipefitter in his later years but had been a meat cutter earlier on. Leo died on 15 July 1993 in Caribou, Maine after having had heart bypass surgery a few years before. He was buried on 17 July 1993 at St. Bruno's cemetery in Van Buren.

Harriet Tilley, the daughter of Delmont Tilley and Aleksandra Michaud, was born on 20 July 1919 in Van Buren. Delmont H. Tilley was born on 2 October 1897 in Island Falls, Maine. He married Aleksandra Michaud on 12 October 1915 in Van Buren. Aleksandra Michaud was born on 9 October 1895 in Van Buren. Aleksandra died on 8 August 1976 in Caribou and was buried in Van Buren.

#3 Severin St. Pierre, the son of Aimabale St. Pierre and Henriette Dupont, was born in 1845. He married Clarice Dube on 6 November 1905 in Van Buren. Severin died in 1919 in Van Buren.

Clarice Dube, the daughter of Ferdinand Dube and Marie Guimond, was born in 1882 and died in 1956 in Van Buren. Her parents, Ferdinand Dube and Marie Guimond, married on 22 October 1877 in St. Luce, Frenchville, Maine.

#4 Aimable St. Pierre, the son of Jean Marie St. Pierre and Judith Marguerite Beaulieu, married Henriette Dupont on 2 September 1845 in St. Basile, Madawaska County, New Brunswick Canada.

Henriette Dupont was the daughter of Louis Marie Dupont and Emilie Dube. Louis and Emilie married on 24 November 1806 at St. Roch des Aulnaies, L'Islet, Quebec.

#5 Jean Marie St. Pierre, son of Alexandre St. Pierre and Catherine Dupont, married Judith Marguerite Beaulieu on 21 February 1803 in Riviere Ouelle, Kamouraska, Quebec.

Judith Marguerite Beaulieu was the daughter of Joseph Marie Beaulieu and Genevieve Gagnon. Joseph and Genevieve married on 18 February 1765 at St. Anne de la Riviere Ouelle, Kamouraska, Quebec.

#6 Alexandre St. Pierre, the son of Alexandre St. Pierre and Marie Anne Chouinard, was born about 12 May 1744 in St. Roch des Aulnaies, L'Islet, Quebec. He married Catherine Dupont on 30 January 1769 in L'Islet sur Mer, L'Islet, Quebec. Alexandre died and was buried on 10 January 1756 in St. Roch des Aulnaies.

Catherine Dupont was the daughter of Noel Dupont and Angelique Morneau. Noel and Angelique were married on 6 February 1737 at L'Islet sur Mer.

#7 Alexandre St. Pierre, son of Pierre St. Pierre and Marie Gerbert, was born on 25 August 1703 in Riviere Ouelle, Kamouraska, Que. He married Marie Anne Chouinard on 15 November 1728 in Notre Dame de Bonsecours, L'Islet, L'Islet, Que.

Marie Anne Chouinard, daughter of Jacques Chouinard and Louise Jean, was born on 25 July 1708 in L'Islet sur Mer. Jacques and Louise were married on 2 June 1692 in Quebec. Marie Anne later married Jean Mignot Labrie on 10 November 1766 at St. Anne de la Pocatiere.

#8 Pierre St. Pierre, son of Michel St. Pierre and Francoise Engrand, was born about 1645 in St. Martin du Pont, France. Pierre was christened on 21 February 1666 in Chateau Richer, Montmorency, Quebec. This span of time between birth and christening would lead one to believe that Pierre may not have been raised in a Catholic family. He died before 4 January 1726 in St. Anne, La Pocatiere or St. Roch des Aulnaies. He was married to Marie Gerbert on 24 April 1679 in St. Famille, Isle Orleans, Quebec.

Marie Gerbert, daughter of Mathurin Gerbert and Elisabeth Targer, was born and christened in 1649. Marie was buried on 11 June 1749 in St. Roch des Aulnaies, L'Islet, Quebec. Mathurin and Elisabeth were married on 4 August 1659 in Quebec.

#9 Michel St. Pierre married Francoise Engrand on 24 November 1627 in St. Martin, Rouen, Normandie, France. The dates of birth of Michel and Francoise is not known and they may never have come to New France.

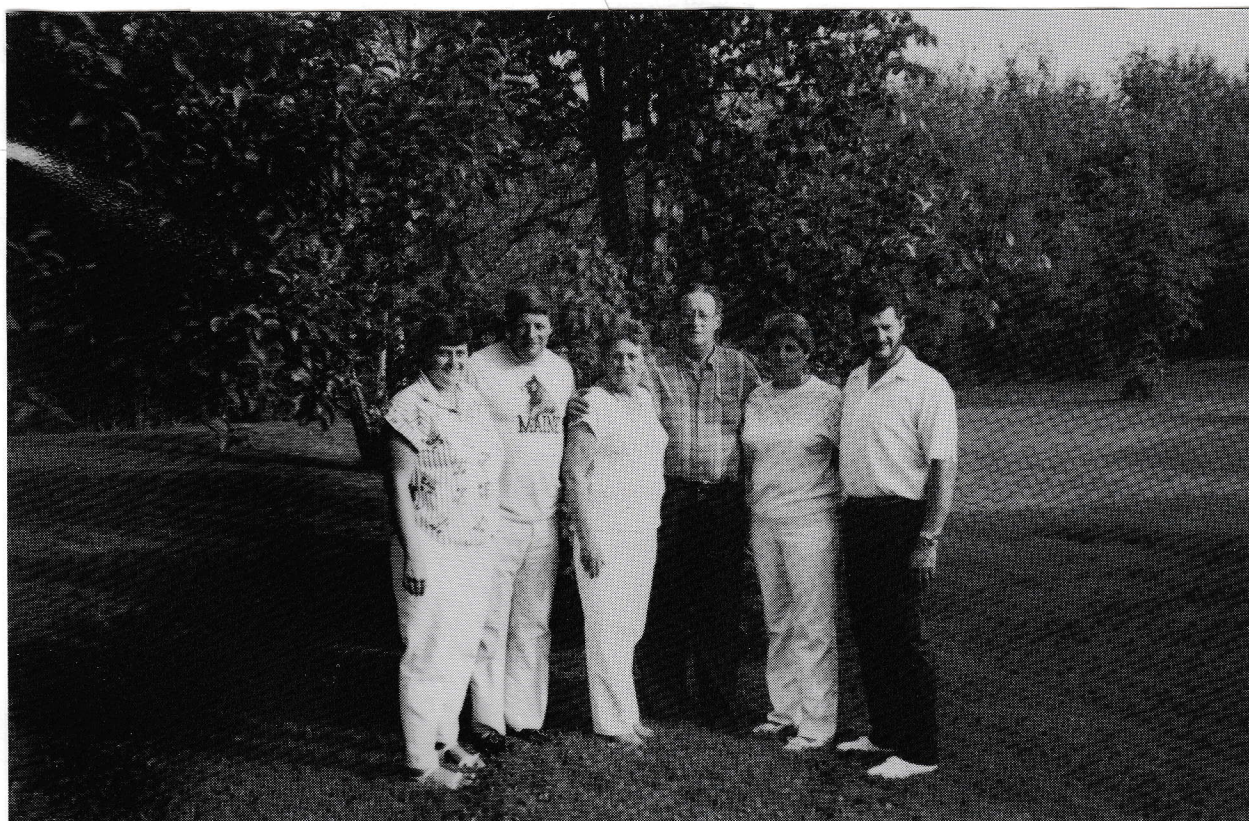

The Gagnon Family

The Gagnon family contributed much to the heritage of the Belangers after grandfather Lucien. Leda Parmella Gagnon brought her family tree into the Belanger family when she married Lucien on 26 October 1887 in Ile Verte, Quebec.

#1 Leda Gagnon, daughter of Paul Gagnon and Marie Ophidie Bergeron, was born on 2 December 1870 at Ile Verte, Riviere du Loup County, Quebec. She died on 27 January 1943 in St. Basile, New Brunswick, Canada. That was 1 1/2 months before I (Jim Belanger) was born and almost four years after the death of her husband. So, you see that no information on my grandparents was obtained first hand.

#2 Paul Gagnon, son of Onesime Gagnon and Julie Gauthier, was born in Ile Verte. He married Marie Ophidie Bergeron on 2 February 1869 at Cacouna, Riviere du Loup County, Quebec. Paul Gagnon died in Fall River, Massachusetts. Paul Gagnon also married Eugenie Cote on 17 May 1892 at Ile Verte and they had one daughter, Marie Julia Gagnon.

Marie Ophidie Bergeron, daughter of Paul Bergeron and Apolline Hudon dit Beaulieu, died in Fall River, Massachusetts. Paul and Apolline were married on 8 January 1833 in Cacouna.

#3 Onesime Gagnon, son of Jean Charles Gagnon and Marie Anne Morin, married Julie Gauthier on 20 January 1846 at Ile Verte.

Julie Gauthier was the daughter of Joseph Gauthier and Julie Dupuis who married on 11 January 1819 at St. Louis de Kamouraska in Kamouraska, Quebec.

#4 Jean Charles Gagnon, son of Charles Gagnon and Marie Anne Ouellette, married Marie Anne Morin on 26 November 1806 at St. Jean Port Joli, Quebec.

Marie Anne Morin was the daughter of Alexis Morin and Marie Anne Belanger who were married on 3 August 1784 at St. Pierre du Sud, Montmagny County, Quebec. Marie Anne Belanger's line may be of some importance here. Her ancestors, starting with her parents, were: Ignace Belanger and Marie Genevieve Gagne, Nicolas Belanger and Marie Magnan then to Nicolas Belanger and Marie de Rainville. This ties the Gagnon line into the same Belanger line as Lucien.

#5 Charles Gagnon, son of Jean Gagnon and Marie Josephe Mignot dit Labrie, married Marie Anne Ouellette on 8 November 1784 at St. Roch des Aulnaies, Quebec.

Marie Anne Ouellette, daughter of Joseph Ouellette and Marie Reine St. Pierre, was born on 6 December 1758 at St. Roch des Aulnaies. The ancestry of Marie Reine St. Pierre is worthy of note. Her lineage starts at her parents Pierre St. Pierre and Marie Gagnon and then goes to Pierre St. Pierre and Marie Gerbert. This ties the Gagnon line into the St. Pierre line for Sandra St. Pierre.

#6 Jean Gagnon, son of Jean Baptiste Gagnon and Francoise St. Pierre, was born in 1730. He married Marie Josephe Mignot dit Labrie on 20 November 1752 at St. Anne de la Pocatiere.

Marie Josephe Mignot, daughter of Charles Mignot dit Labrie and Marie Madeleine Aubert, was born on 28 March 1730 at St. Anne de la Pocatiere. Charles and Marie Madeleine were married on 12 January 1728 at St. Anne de la Pocatiere, Kamouraska County, Quebec.

#7 Jean Baptiste Gagnon, son of Pierre Gagnon and Barbe Fortin, was born on 25 January 1688 at St. Anne de Beaupre, Montmorency County, Quebec. He married Francoise St. Pierre on 4 January 1726 at St. Roch des Aulnaies. Jean Baptiste was the widower of Francoise Ouellette who he had married on 15 January 1714 at Riviere Ouelle. Francoise Ouellette was born on 12 August 1692 at Riviere Ouelle. Jean Baptiste and Francoise Ouellette had one daughter named Francoise Gagnon born on 20 April 1719 at St. Roch des Aulnaies. Their daughter would have been seven years of age when Jean Baptiste remarried.

Francoise St. Pierre, daughter of Pierre St. Pierre and Marie Gerbert, was born on 8 January 1694 at Riviere Ouelle, Kamouraska County Quebec. Pierre and Marie Gerbert were married on 24 April 1679 at St. Famille on the Isle of Orleans. This marriage provides yet another tie into the same St. Pierre family as Sandra St. Pierre.

#8 Pierre Gagnon, son of Pierre Gagnon and Vincente Desvarieux, was born about 1646. He married Barbe Fortin on 6 February 1669 in Chateau Richer, Montmorency County, Quebec. Pierre died on 10 August 1687 at St. Anne de Beaupre.

Barbe Fortin, daughter of Julien Fortin dit Bellefontaine and Genevieve Gamache dit Lamarre, was born on 21 October 1654 at Quebec. She died about 27 August 1737 at the age of 82. Julien and Genevieve were married on 11 November 1652 at Cap Tourmente, Quebec. Julien and Genevieve were both born in France.

#9 Pierre Gagnon, son of Pierre Gagnon and Madeleine Renee Royer, was born about 14 February 1612 at St. Madeleine de la Ventrouze in France. He married Vincente Desvarieux on 14 September 1642 at Quebec. Pierre died about 17 April 1699 at Chateau Richer.

Vincente Desvarieux, daughter of Jean Desvarieux and Marie Chevalier, was born about 1624. She died on 2 January 1695 at Chateau Richer. Jean and Marie Chevalier were born and married in France.

#10 Pierre Gagnon, son of Barnabe Gagnon and Francoise Crest, was born in France. He married Madeleine Renee Royer dit Roger about 1597 in France. Pierre died between 1630 and 1633 in France. No other information is available on Madeleine Renee Royer.

The Gagnon family had been in France for generations as indicated by the family crest, which bears a half moon, which is an indication that some of the Gagnon ancestors participated in the Crusades. Pierre Gagnon and his wife Madeleine Renee Royer (Roger) were well established among the "bourgeoisie." They had seven children: Mathurin, Jean, Pierre, Noel, Olivier, Marguerite, and another daughter. The Family resided in "La Gaignonniere," a little village where seven Gagnon families lived and worked the land.

The Gagons came to Canada because they were merchants and traders. They owned a small inn in Tourouvre called "L'Auberge du Cheval Blanc" ("The White Horse Inn"). This was a popular meeting place, and it was here where people would come to sign contracts for engagements to settle in New France. It is probably this exposure to all the travelers which interested the Gagons brothers to emigrate to New France. The biggest reason for French citizens to migrate to New France was to get away from the wars in Europe. These people, generally, were not poor and had good farms but they just couldn't put up with the constant turmoil and fighting.

The three brothers brought goods with them, from France, and set up a business in Quebec by the early 1640's. They opened a store, in 1658, and they owned a farm in Chateau-Richer, on the Beaupre shore. Mathurin was the only one of the brothers who could read and write so he, naturally,

became the head of the family in New France. Within a short time he was appointed to the "Conseil Souverain" (the Sovereign Council"). This was considered a great honor as only the top 10 most prominent citizens of the city were appointed to this council. Mathurin did not marry until his two brothers had married and were established. At the age of 41, he married Francoise Godeau dit Boudeau, who was only 13 years old.

We find many families with the Gagnon name also named Belle Isles or Belzile or Belzil. This seems to have come about from one Jean Gagnon who became a Commander in the local militia. His title was "Commandant de la Milice de la Rive Sud et Gardien des isles". This is translated to mean, "Commandant of the militia of the south side of the river and guardian of the islands". From this title, Jean began signing documents as Jean Gagnon des Belle Isles meaning Jean Gagnon of the Beautiful Islands. As with many other dit names in New France, often the Gagnon was dropped and Belle Isles was used which soon became abbreviated to Belzile.



The Michaud Family

The Michaud family plays a prominent role in both the Belanger and St. Pierre families. My mother was Irene Michaud and my wife, Sandra, had grandparents named Michaud. Although both families lived in Van Buren, the two lines of Michauds do not merge until several generations earlier.

#1 Irene Michaud, daughter of Louis Philippe Michaud and Laura Cormier, was born on 24 September 1912 in Van Buren, Maine. She married Gerald Belanger on 22 August 1932 in Van Buren. Irene died on 15 January 1983 in Caribou, Maine.

Gerald Belanger, son of Lucien Belanger and Parmella Gagnon, was born on 28 January 1910 in Grand Falls, New Brunswick and died on 12 July 1976 in Caribou, Maine.

#2 Louis Philip Michaud, son of Philippe Michaud and Marie Castonguay, was born on 17 December 1888 at Edmundston, New Brunswick. He married Laura Cormier on 19 April 1909. When Laura died, at the age of 27, Louis Philippe was left with four young children to care for. He married Alma Lapointe on 12 November 1917 (one year after Laura's death) and it was Alma we all knew as our grandmother. Louis Philippe and Alma had no children of their own. Philippe died on 21 May 1949 at Van Buren, Maine of a cerebral hemorrhage.

Laura Cormier, daughter of John B Cormier and Julie Martin, was born on 31 March 1889. She died on 29 October 1916 in Van Buren, Maine. John B Cormier is probably the anglicized version of the name Jean Baptiste. John and Julie were married on 30 October 1882 in Lille, Maine. Since the Cormier line is the first connection the family of Gerald Belanger and Irene Michaud have with the Acadians, that family line will be covered next.

#3 Philippe Michaud, son of Philippe Michaud and Severine Berube, was born on 14 October 1867 at St. Cecile du Bic in Rimouski County, Quebec. He married Marie Castonguay on 24 January 1888 at St. Patrice, Riviere du Loup, Quebec. Philippe died on 21 January 1931 in Corrigan, Maine. Philippe and Marie had six children, two boys and four girls.

Marie Castonguay, daughter of Edouard Castonguay and Cesarie Theriault, was born in 1870. She died in 1944 at the age of 74. Edouard and Cesarie were married in St. Epiphane, Riviere du Loup on 13 July 1868.

#4 Philippe Michaud, son of Joseph Michaud and Constance Sirois, married Severine Berube on 21 January 1856 in St. Simon, Rimouski.

Severine Berube was the daughter of Michel Berube and Euphrosine Levesque. Michel and Euphrosine were married on 1 February 1813 in Riviere Ouelle, Quebec.

#5 Joseph Michaud, son of Louis Michaud and Genevieve Roussel, married Constance Sirois on 11 February 1834 in Cacouna, Riviere du Loup, Quebec.

Constance Sirois was the daughter of Jean Sirois and Suzanne Saindon. Jean and Suzanne were married on 19 July 1796 in Ile Verte, Quebec.

#6 Louis Michaud, son of Jean Francois Michaud and Marie Anne Cote married Genevieve Roussel on 10 January 1791 in Riviere Ouelle, Quebec.

Genevieve Roussel was the daughter of Jacques Roussel and Genevieve Berube who married on 12 January 1750.

#7 Jean Francois Michaud, son of Jean Michaud and Cecile Ouellette, was born on 12 May 1729 in Kamouraska, Quebec. He married Marie Anne Cote on 27 October 1752 in Trois Pistoles, Riviere du Loup, Quebec.

Marie Anne Cote was the daughter of Jean Baptiste Cote and Genevieve Bernier who married on 17 July 1720 at Cap St. Ignace, Montmagny County, Quebec.

#8 Jean Michaud, son of Jean Baptiste Michaud and Marie Vaillancourt, was born on 2 July 1701 in Riviere Ouelle. He married Genevieve Bernier in 1728 at Kamouraska.

Genevieve Bernier, daughter of Jean Baptiste Bernier and Genevieve Caron, was born about 24 March 1697 at Cap St. Ignace. Jean and Genevieve Caron were married on 30 October 1694 in St. Anne de Beaupre.

#9 Jean Baptiste Michaud, son of Pierre Michaud and Marie Ancelin, was born on 8 January 1674 at Ile aux Grues, Montmagny County, Quebec. He married Marie Vaillancourt on 3 June 1697 at St. Pierre, Isle of Orleans, Quebec. Jean Baptiste later married Marie Francoise Dupil, daughter of Remi Dupil and Ann Lagou, on 28 February 1707 at Riviere Ouelle. They had no children. Jean Baptiste died before 1720 in Kamouraska.

Marie Vaillancourt, daughter of Robert Vaillancourt and Marie Gobeil, was born about 5 September 1674 at St. Famille, Isle of Orleans, Quebec. Marie died on 2 June 1706 in Kamouraska. Robert and Marie Gobeil were married in 1668 at Chateau Richer.

#10 Pierre Michaud, son of Antoine Michaud and Marie Juin, was born about 1637 in Poitou, France. He married Marie Ancelin on 2 October 1667 in Chateau Richer. Pierre died on 18 April 1729 in Kamouraska. Antoine Michaud and Marie Juin were both born and married in France.

Marie Ancelin, daughter of Rene Ancelin and Claire Rousselot, was born on 7 May 1651 in Notre Dame de la Rochelle, France. She died about 18 April 1729 in Kamouraska, Quebec. Rene and Claire Rousselot were married on 3 November 1647 in France.



The Cormier Family

The Cormier family is our Acadian link. We have some Acadian backgrounds in some of the other families but the Cormiers are the most recent and obvious. Due to the expulsion, the Acadian lines are very difficult to trace. The Cormiers, however, were prominent enough to provide us with a link back to France.

#1 Laura Cormier, daughter of John B Cormier and Julie Martin, was born on 31 March 1889. She married Louis Philippe Michaud on 19 April 1909. When Laura died, at the age of 27, her youngest daughter, Cecile, went to live with Laura's sister, Agnes. Agnes had married Joseph Michaud, Louis Philippe's brother and they agreed to raise Cecile as their own. It was not until high school years that Cecile and Irene found out they were sisters and not cousins.

Louis Philippe Michaud, son of Philippe Michaud and Marie Castonguay, was born on 17 December 1888 at Edmundston, New Brunswick. He married Alma Lapointe on 12 November 1917, one year after Laura's death. Philippe died on 21 May 1949 at Van Buren, Maine of a cerebral hemorrhage.

#2 John B Cormier, son of Louison Cormier and Eleonore Cyr, was born in 1853. He married Julie Martin on 30 October 1882 in Lille, Maine. He later married Malvina Berube on 18 April 1907. John died on 30 January 1930 at the age of 77.

Julie Martin, daughter of Michel Martin and Flavie Martin, was born in 1860. She died on 3 July 1904 at the age of 44. Her parents were married on 16 April 1850 at St. Basile, Madawaska County, New Brunswick. Michel Martin and Flavie Martin were second cousins. Their common ancestor was Francois Martin.

#3 Louison Cormier, son of Jean Francois Cormier and Charlotte Fournier, was born in 1818. He married Eleonore Cyr on 22 May 1849 at St. Basile, New Brunswick. Louison died in 1912 at the age of 94. Louison Cormier was involved in the signing of the Ashburton Treaty of 1842. He was from Grand Isle and was the first Registrar of Deeds in the Madawaska District along the South shores of the St. John River, which was now part of Maine.

Eleonore Cyr was the daughter of Germain Cyr and Scholastique Theriault. Germain Cyr and Scholastique were married on 17 November 1818 at St. Basile, New Brunswick.

#4 Jean Francois Cormier, son of Jean Baptiste Cormier and Madeleine Landry, was born in 1772. He married Charlotte Fournier on 19 July 1803 at St. Basile, New Brunswick. He had been the first miller of Grand Isle when he died at age 58 in 1830.

Charlotte Fournier, daughter of Jean Marie Fournier and Marie Angelique Dionne, was born in 1781. She died in 1854 at the age of 73. Her parents were married on 13 February 1757 at St. Thomas of Montmagny in Quebec.

#5 Jean Baptiste Cormier, son of Pierre Cormier and Cecile Thibodeau, was born between 1732 and 1733 in Beaubassin, Acadia, Nova Scotia. He married Madeleine Landry on 5 July 1762 in Kamouraska, Quebec. From the dates here, it is obvious that Jean Baptiste went to Quebec to escape the expulsion in Acadia. The place and date of Jean Baptiste's death is unknown but his wife,

Madeleine Landry remarried on 22 August 1775 in Kamouraska which would indicate that he had died before that date.

Madeleine Landry, daughter of Alexis Landry and Marguerite Aucoin dit Bergeron, was born in 1742. She married a second time to Jean Baptiste Levasseur on 22 August 1775. Madeleine's parents were married on 27 November 1739.

#6 Pierre Cormier, son of Pierre Cormier and Catherine Leblanc, was born in 1704 at Beaubassin, Acadia. He married Cecile Thibodeau on 17 July 1730 in Grand Pre, Acadia. Pierre died before 1765 at age 61. Pierre and Cecile Thibodeau had 12 children. On 11 February 1747, 470 New England troops, under Colonel Arthur Noble, were defeated in the Battle of Grand Pre. Coulon de Villiers, after a forced march from Beausejour on snowshoes and with a little handful of Grand Pre farmers as his army, became the attacking party during a severe snowstorm. The next eight years were difficult ones in Halifax. The culmination was on 10 September 1755 when the people of Grand Pre were herded on transports to be conveyed to the United States. Later, many returned to Nova Scotia, and a large number of the 6,500 Acadians transported into exile have descendants in the provinces. There were 418 Acadian men and boys and an unknown number of women included in the expulsion. It is unknown how Pierre was affected by this or if he had already relocated to Quebec where his son, Pierre, was married in 1762.

Cecile Thibodeau was the daughter of Jean Baptiste Thibodeau and Marguerite Hebert. Jean Baptiste and Marguerite were married on 17 February 1703 at Port Royal, Acadia.

#7 Pierre Cormier, son of Thomas Charles Cormier and Madeline Girouard, was born on 25 March 1682 at Beaubassin, Acadia. He married Catherine Leblanc in 1703 at St. Charles des Mines, Acadia. Pierre died before 1730 in Beaubassin, Acadia. Pierre and Catherine Leblanc had 11 children. Pierre, his brother Alexis and his brother Francois married sisters; Catherine, Marie and Marguerite LeBlanc. The census of the parish of Beaubassin in 1714 shows Pierre Cormier, his wife Catherine Leblanc and children Pierre, Marie, Jean Baptiste, Madeleine, Michel and Catherine.

Catherine Leblanc, daughter of Jacques Leblanc and Catherine Hebert, was born about 1682 or 1683. Her parents were married in 1673 at Grand Pre, Acadia.

#8 Thomas Charles Cormier, son of Robert Cormier and Marie Piraud, was born about 1636 in La Rochelle, Aunis, France. He married Madeline Girouard about 1668 in Port Royale, Acadia. Thomas died in 1689 at Beaubassin, Acadia at age 53. Thomas was a carpenter and farmer, like his father. He had 11 children. The census of Beaubassin for 1686 shows Thomas Cormier, his wife Madeleine Girouer, 5 daughters and Francois age 16, Alexis age 14, Germain age 10 and Pierre age 8. (Note: the names of the girls were seldom taken during a census). The census of Port Royal for 1671 shows Thomas Cormier, a carpenter at age 35, with his wife Madeline Girouard, 1 daughter, 7 cattle and 7 sheep.

Madeline Girouard, daughter of Francois Girouard and Marie Jeanne Aucoin, was born about 1654 in Poitou, France. It is odd to note that her parents were married about 1647 in Port Royal, Acadia. It is not known why Madeline was born in France but the assumption must be made that Marie Jeanne Aucoin Girouard must have returned to France to give birth to Madeline.

#9 Robert Cormier arrived at Cape Breton around 1644 as an employee of Nicolas Denye. Robert was a Master Carpenter. Robert married Marie Piraud about 1634 in Aunis, Larochele, France. He died on 12 Feb 1711 or 1712. No information is available on his spouse, Marie Piraud.

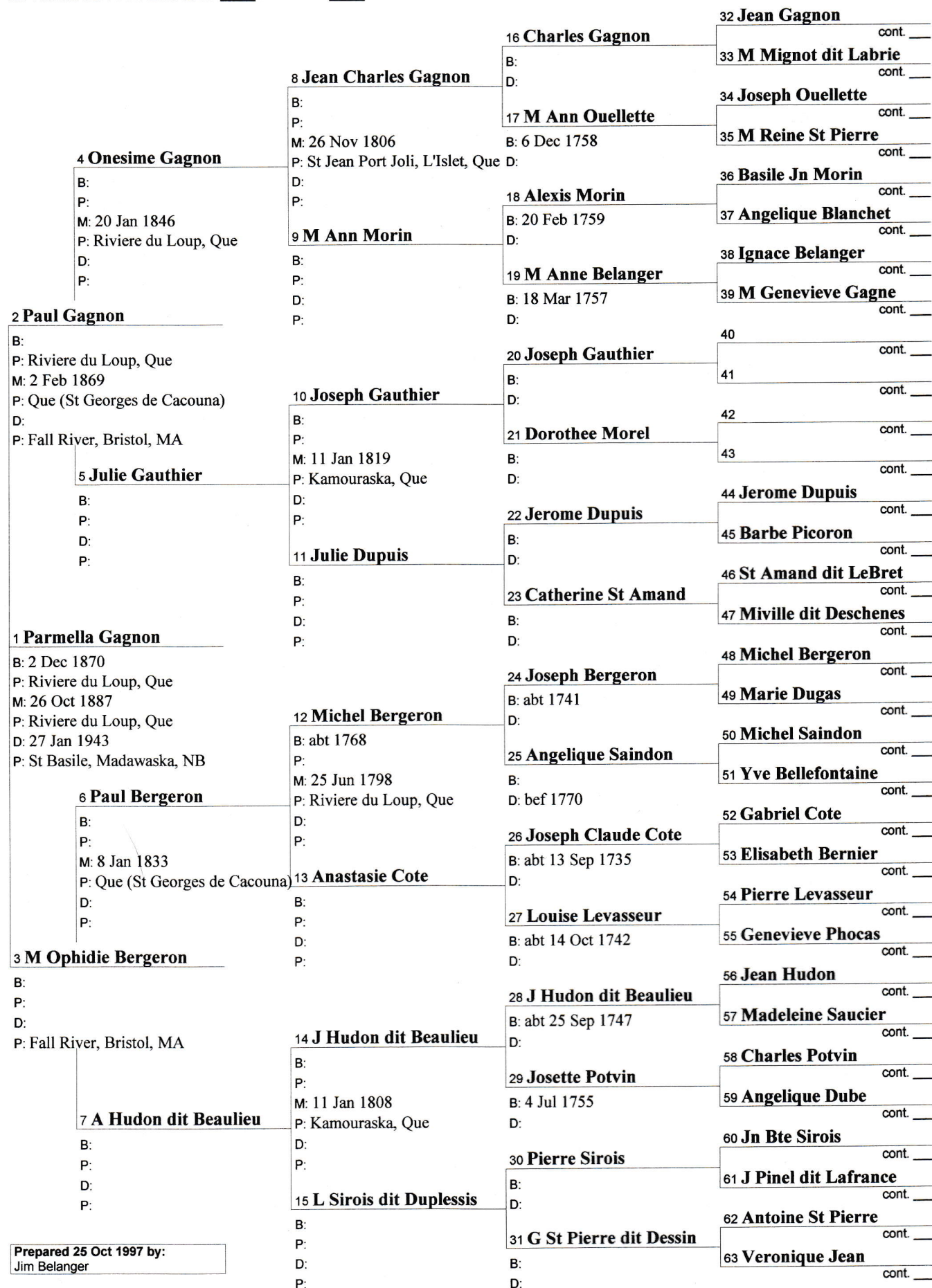
